


Sandwich Boards in the Downtown

A sandwich board is a type of “A-frame” sign often found on the sidewalk outside of a business in the downtown. These signs are permitted in the downtown by City ordinance under certain conditions.

1. One sandwich board is permitted per address. This means that addresses with multiple tenants may only place one sandwich board sign outside.
2. Sandwich boards must not obstruct the sidewalk or vision triangle. They must be placed to provide at least 5 feet of clearance for pedestrians.
3. Sandwich boards must be placed on the sidewalk in front of the business that it is advertising.
4. Sandwich boards may only be displayed during business hours. The sign must be removed from the sidewalk daily and brought into the business upon closing.
5. Sandwich boards in the downtown are limited in size to 2 ½ feet wide by 2 ½ to 4 feet tall.
6. Signs not in compliance with these provisions may be removed by the City. A recovery fee of five dollars per sign will be charged to the owner for return of the sign. Any sign not recovered within 7 days may be disposed of by the city.
